

OMC Membership Meeting Minutes November 6, 2019

1. **Call to order.** Don MacDonald called the meeting to order at 12:15 PM.
2. **Introduction of guests.** One guests was introduced, Richard Bennett.
Introduction of Special guest, Freeman Johnson, a 99 year old veteran of the attack of Pearl Harbor.
3. **Secretaries Meeting Minutes.** Paul Goyette introduced the minutes from the October 2, 2019 meeting. The minutes had been distributed on line with the meeting announcement. A motion was made and seconded to accept the minutes. The motion passed unanimously.
4. **Treasurer's Report.** Frank Ward presented the treasurer's report. Frank continues to feel that the club's finances are stable and is doing well financially. We have 185 paid members. The beginning balance for the period was \$30,854 and the ending balance is \$48,941 This balance consists of the scholarship account of \$37,461 and the operating account for \$11,480 The total cash receipts were \$19,857 and the total cash disbursements were \$1,770. Frank pointed out that the club has committed \$15,000 in 2020 and \$20,000 in 2021 for total scholarship awards of \$35,000 in the next two years..
5. **Membership.** Don MacDonald and George French made a motion for Dave Sandel to become an Honorary Member, the motion was passed and Dave was presented an OMC plaque. Richard Bennett then gave his induction speeches. The membership is 200, with 5 honorary, and five associate.
6. **Future Speakers.** Don MacDonald spoke to this topic. Today's speaker is Col. Chris Hurley from joint Base Cape Cod. Col. Hurley is with the 102nd Intelligence Wing. Future speakers are TBD.
7. **Fellowship.** Chuck Wry and Ken Molloy lead the membership in singing the for our Various services. Chuck paid respects for John Aversa 94,Navy Veteran, Carl Bradburg, 88 Coast Guard, Warren Hanson, 94 Navy Veteran.
8. **Scholarship.** Jim Ruane presented the scholarship status. All is sound, and the OMC is ready to award four, five thousand dollar scholarship awards.
1. **10. Good Guy Award** . Bill Keto presented the new recommended guidelines for nomination and selection of an OMC Good Guy. The new guidelines are to include club activities as well as activities outside the club. Continued volunteer service in any civic, religious or humanitarian activity, either via an OMC program or directly to a community organization. The members voted unanimously in favor.
2. **11. Golf.** Don Lee reported that the fall season had come to a successful conclusion. Beginning on September16th the following six courses were played: The Dunes Course at New Seabury, Ridge Club, TGC at Sacconnesset, Wianno Golf Club, Indian Pond Club and Pocasset Golf Club. The weather was good and the golf clubs appreciated our business. Two club Champions named for 2019(determined by scores at the spring and fall Wianno outings.)
Paul Leverone defended his title and won with the lowest gross score over two rounds. Clyde Takala won the low net score title.
Interesting facts; 46 OMC members participated in the fall tour. There were 78 different guest who played. The average turnout for each outing was 54 golfers. A big thankyou was

offered to the golf committee consisting of Don MacDonald, Paul Goyette, Fred Mesinger, Tim Moran, Paul Ruane and John Cookson. Next year's spring tour will begin on April 27th.

12. **Events.** Don Megathlin presented the events schedule. The Christmas dinner will be held at the Cummaquid Club on 11 December. Reserving tables will be not allowed.

13. **Rennie Discussion Group.** David Reid reported that next meeting will be held on Tuesday November 12, the topic will be "One Year Out" the Election. Reasons to keep, reasons to change.

14. **Miracle Workers.** Ken Molloy spoke about the Miracle Workers. The club prepares the lunch once per month on the first Monday at the Salvation Army building in Hyannis.
